YAHWEH IS OUR STRENGTH

"Yahweh is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in Him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise Him" (Psalms 28:7).

1. The Strength We All Seek:
